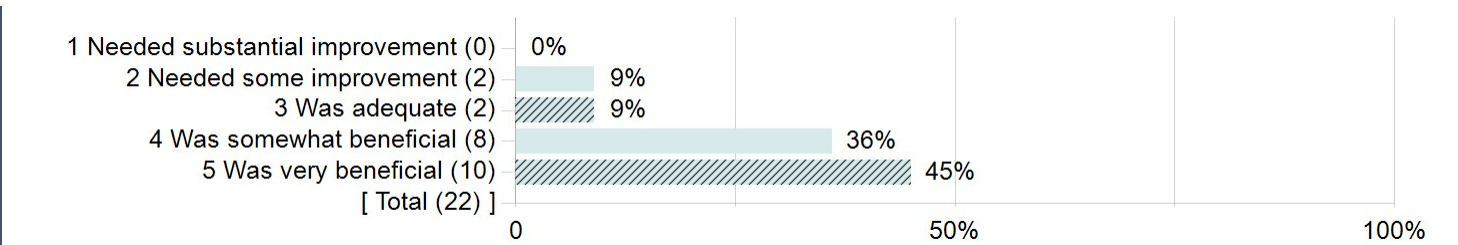


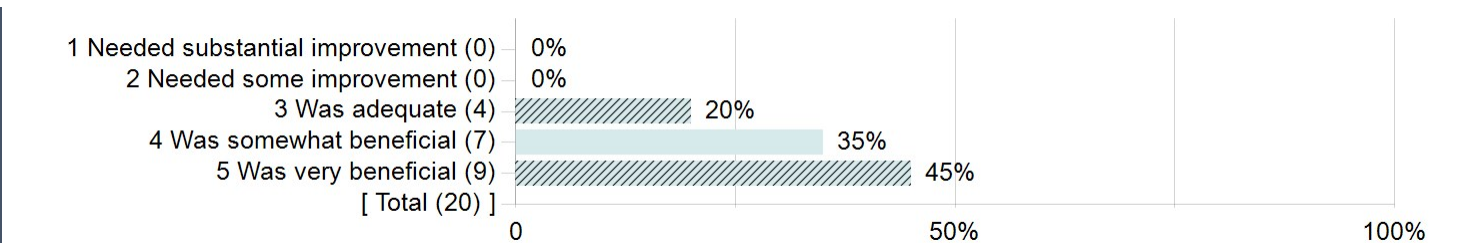

1. My attendance and engagement during class time



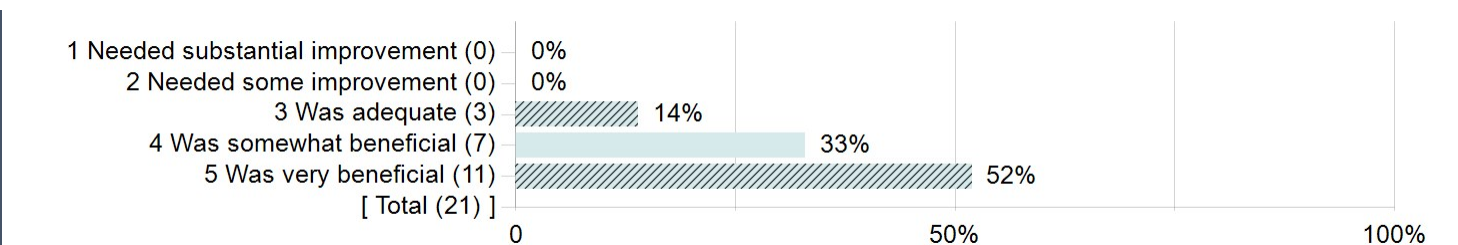

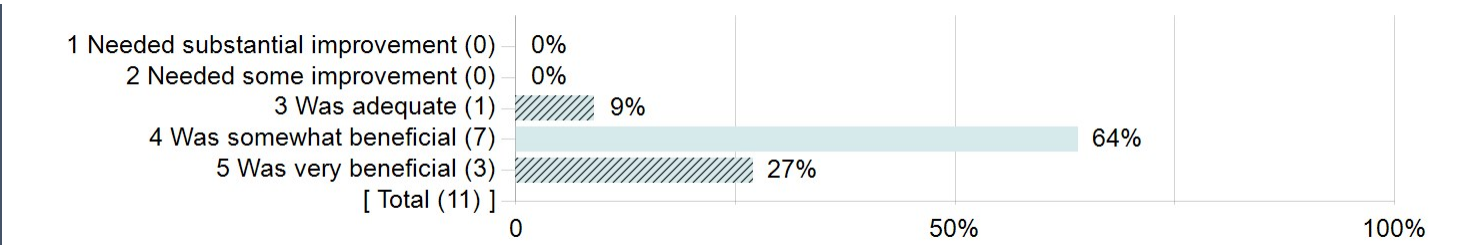
Comment

Since comments and questions were frequently shot down by the professor and the class had many students, I believe small group discussions would have been beneficial for this class because it would be easier to share ideas, get to know the students in the class, and hear other student's perspectives. Lastly, feedback on papers was not helpful and I was left more confused after reading his feedback.

He was so understanding and kind, he really hopes you do the best and is super accessible outside the class. If there's anything that you want to be cleared up, he'll definitely be willing to help out.

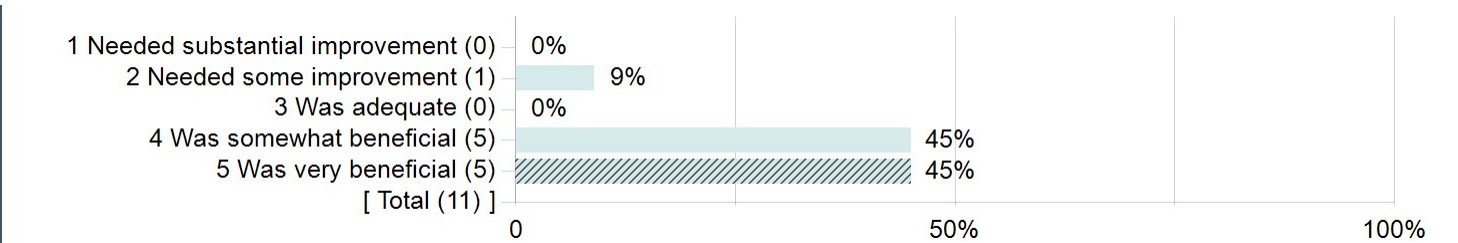
